RESIDENTS CAN RECYCLE CONCRETE AT THE SOLID WASTE COMPLEX

Millville, NJ: The Cumberland County Improvement Authority makes it easy for residents to recycle a number of different items and this is one factor that has helped make Cumberland County the #1 Recycling County in New Jersey. Residents that remove old sidewalks, driveways, other concrete items on their property free of rebar and wire, or have old block or brick they need to dispose of can recycle it, free of charge, at the landfill. The recycled concrete is used at the Solid Waste Complex to construct roadways and ramps. Larger pieces are used for erosion control.

The landfill is located on 169 Jesse Bridge Road in Rosenhayn, Deerfield Township. The hours of operation are Monday through Friday 8:00 am to 3:30 pm and extended hours on Saturday from 8:00 am to noon. "It is easy for residents to access the landfill," said Bob Pollock, facility manager, "during the week or on Saturday. Residents may have too much trash for the trash man to handle or just want to get rid of it right away." Residents can bring their waste to the County Complex and pay the tipping fee based on weight and trash type. Most recyclable items, such as concrete, are accepted at the landfill free of charge. Cumberland County is #1 in recycling because of the working partnerships it has with its municipalities, business and community groups, and residents that care about the environment.
